Re: EOC Summer School Information

EOC Summer School will be held for students who did not meet the NC proficiency standard of a Level 3, 4, or 5 for the End-of-Course (EOC) Tests in Biology, English II, and Math I. Any student who has not earned a proficiency score of a Level 3, 4, or 5 is eligible for EOC Summer School. Students who earned a Level 1 or 2 and FAILED the class are additionally eligible for Credit Recovery. If they attend all days of EOC Summer School, work diligently, and demonstrate a successful retest, they will earn the failed credit back and will not have to retake the entire course. The EOC Summer School is taught face-to-face by licensed CHS Biology, English II, and Math I teachers. The school information is as follows:

- Monday, June 19, 2017 – Friday, June 23, 2017.
- Summer School begins at 8:30, and the school is open at 8:00. School ends each day at 2:30.
- Clinton City Schools will provide bus transportation in Express Routes. Express Routes do not have as many stops as a normal bus route.
- The students will break for lunch at roughly 11:00. A free lunch is provided at Sampson Middle School. Students are welcome to bring their own lunch if they prefer. There will be breaks given, so change for a drink machine is advisable.
- Students will be expected to surrender electronic devices to ensure academic focus without distraction.
- Teacher instruction, some computer assisted, will be provided that is tailored to the individual students' needs to achieve proficiency.
- Attendance is mandatory – students who miss one day will return the following week to complete the EOC Summer School online.
