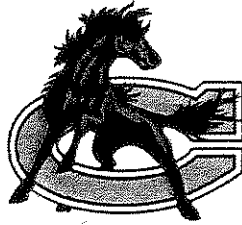

Future-Ready Core Graduation Requirements

- ▶ 4 English 
- ▶ 4 Math 
 - Math I, Math II, Math III
 - 4th math course (aligned with student's post-secondary plans)
- ▶ 3 Science 
 - Earth/Environmental Science
 - Biology
 - A physical science (Chemistry, Physics, or Physical Science)
- ▶ 4 Social Studies 
 - World History
 - Civics & Economics
 - American Hist. I, II OR US History AP *and* European History AP

Future-Ready Core Graduation Requirements (cont.)

▶ **1 Health & PE**

▶ **13 Electives** (minimum)

- 2 Electives from Arts, CTE, or Second Language
- 4 additional electives in any of the following areas:
 - Career Technical Education (Career Clusters)
 - Fine Arts (Band, Theatre, Visual Arts)
 - Other subject areas of concentration (AP, SCC, Online Courses, Second Language, English, PE, JROTC)

Honors and AP Courses

- Rigorous, accelerated levels of study
- Many require summer assignments or projects
- Additional hours of outside reading, homework, projects
- Check Curriculum Guide for pre-requisites and requirements

Entered high school prior to 2015-16 (i.e. rising seniors)

- ▶ Honors/CCP: +1.0 QP
- ▶ AP: +2.0 QP

Entered high school 2015-16 and later (i.e. rising freshmen, sophomores, juniors)

- ▶ Honors: +.5 QP
- ▶ AP/CCP: +1.0 QP

▶ **9th Grade:**

- Math I (Math II ONLY if you took Math I in 8th grade)
- English I
- World History
- Earth Environmental Science (Biology HN if you took EES HN in 8th grade)
- Health/PE
- 3 electives of your choice (band, arts, JROTC, CTE courses)

Determine the LEVEL (Regular, HN, HN Adv) based on your grades and teacher recommendation

▶ **10th Grade:**

- Math II or Math III (depending on previous math)
- English II
- Civics and Economics
- Physical Science OR Biology HN
- 4 electives of your choice (band, arts, JROTC, CTE courses, AP courses)

So What Classes Do I Register For...?

▶ **11th Grade:**

- Math III, AFM, or Pre-Calc HN (depending on previous math)
- English III
- American History I or US History AP
- Biology OR Chemistry/Physical Science
- 4 electives of your choice (band, arts, JROTC, CTE courses, AP courses, CCP courses)

Determine the LEVEL (Regular, HN, AP) based on your grades and teacher recommendation



So What Classes Do I Register For...?

▶ 12th Grade:

- AFM, Pre-Calc HN, Calc HN/AP (depending on previous math)
- English IV
- American History II or European History AP
- 5+ electives of your choice (band, arts, JROTC, CTE courses, AP courses, CCP courses)

Determine the LEVEL (Regular, HN, AP) based on your grades and teacher recommendation



Promotion Requirements

- ▶ Promotion to 9th Grade:
 - Successful Completion of 8th Grade
- ▶ Promotion to 10th Grade:
 - Successful Completion of 7 units which must include English I and one unit of math
- ▶ Promotion to 11th Grade:
 - Successful Completion of 14 units which must include English II and one additional unit of math
- ▶ Promotion to 12th Grade:
 - Successful Completion of 21 units which must include English III and one additional unit of math

NC Academic Scholars Program

- ▶ Unweighted GPA of 3.5 or higher
- ▶ 4 units of English
- ▶ 4 units of Mathematics (including Math I, Math II, Math III and a higher level math)
- ▶ 3 units of Science (a Physics or Chemistry, Biology, and Earth/Environmental Science)
- ▶ 4 units of Social Studies (World History, Civics/Economics, and American History I/II)
- ▶ 2 units in foreign language
- ▶ 1 unit of Health and Physical Education
- ▶ 4 units in a CTE concentration, Arts, Languages or JROTC
- ▶ 3 units in higher level courses which carry 4.5 or 5 quality points (Honors, AP, SCC, Advanced CTE)

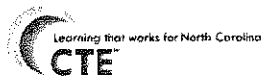

CTE Honor Society

Eligibility:

1. Junior or senior currently enrolled in a CTE course.
 2. Successfully completed at least two CTE courses in the same area.
 3. Earned a minimum grade of an A in the CTE course taken before year of eligibility.
 4. Not have a failing grade for any class during the year of eligibility.
 5. Achieved an overall minimum weighted GPA of at least 3.0.
 6. Attend the induction ceremony unless an excused absence is granted by the principal.
 7. *Exhibit good conduct.
**If a student is assigned OSS, eligibility or membership will be terminated.*
- ▶ Senior year: Receive red honor cord during the ceremony
 - Wear at graduation and all cap and gown events

UNC System Course Requirements

- ▶ High School Diploma
- ▶ Four Units of English
- ▶ Four Units of Math
 - Math I, Math II, Math III, +1 higher level course
- ▶ Four Units of Social Studies (including World History, Civics and American History I and II)
- ▶ Three Units of Science (including a life science, Physical Science and a laboratory science)
- ▶ Two Units of the same Second Language

UNC Minimum Admissions Requirements

(Entering 2013 and Beyond)

- ▶ SAT of 880 on new or 800 on old version (verbal and math) or ACT composite of 17
- ▶ The minimum high school GPA for first time freshmen is 2.5

NC Community College Requirements


- ▶ Open enrollment for all graduating seniors
- ▶ Placement testing waived if
 - GPA is 2.6 or higher AND
 - Completion of 4 high school math courses
- ▶ On-Site Placement Testing available if students don't meet above requirements

Parent Role in the College Process

- ▶ Encourage a challenging course load
- ▶ Help research college admissions requirements
- ▶ Provide a "College Notebook" for the family
- ▶ Attach your email to your student's CFNC account, ACT and College Board account
- ▶ Travel to college fairs or open house dates
- ▶ Allow your child to drive this process
