Your Clinton High Student has gotten off to a wonderful start! As is always the case, we work to keep you informed of changes/amendments of policy and procedure. The Clinton High School (CHS) 2017-2018 Student Handbook (hard copy provided to your student in September) has been amended to aid in cross-referencing the Clinton City Schools 2017-18 Student/Parent Handbook. The change with the Tardy Policy are listed below and affect few students, but it is well worth your time to review with your student. The updated CHS 2017-18 Student Handbook is found on our website in PDF version. Additionally, you are also able to access the Clinton City Schools 2017-18 Student/Parent Handbook on the Clinton City Schools website.

The changes that were made to the Clinton High School 2017-2018 Student Handbook are as follows:

- On page 34 under the TARDY POLICY, we added a clarifying chart that is currently in the Clinton City Schools Student/Parent Handbook on page 94. The chart is entitled, CHS TARDY POLICY GRADES 9-12.
- To provide an easier cross-reference from the 2017-18 CHS Student Handbook to the 2017-18 Clinton City Schools Student/Parent Handbook, we added page number references for the following policies: ATTENDANCE POLICY: (Policy 4400); ASSAULTS, THREATS, AND HARASSMENT: (Policy 4331); THEFT, TRESPASS AND DAMAGE TO PROPERTY: (Policy 4330); DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR: (Policy 4315); CLINTON HIGH SCHOOL DRESS CODE: (Policy 4316); CLINTON HIGH SCHOOL USE OF WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICES: (Policy 4318); and also with the CLINTON HIGH SCHOOL PLAGIARISM POLICY (Policy 4310).
